

Success is defined as the “achievement of something planned or attempted.”

With help from the staff at Refuge of Hope, Milo and Brian each envisioned a plan, set it in motion and achieved success. Currently both are employed and living in their own housing. This is a measurement of success for two men who recently experienced hopelessness and homelessness.

You first met Milo two years ago when he was featured in our newsletter. Milo’s background was one of abuse as a child, drug addiction, a failed marriage, loss of a business he built and his attempt to take his own life. This road of destruction led him to Refuge of Hope where he found desperately needed physical, emotional and spiritual support. That encouraged him to transform his life. When faced with problems, Milo met them head on and broke through his barriers to achieve success.

Brian’s troubles were different. He came to Refuge of Hope because of situational poverty. After 18 years with a company, Brian suddenly found himself without employment due to the economic downturn. Soon his savings were gone and with no employment opportunities in sight, he came to Refuge of Hope homeless and alone. A local businessman contacted Refuge of Hope asking if we had a reliable man to work for him. Brian was recommended. Sixteen months later he is still employed, living in his own apartment and recently was

able to purchase a car. He is living a life now that at his lowest point seemed highly improbable.

Has this road to success been smooth and without bumps for either of these men? Of course not, but there is a big difference this time around. Milo knows the Lord is with him and that his support team, of which Refuge of Hope remains a huge part, is in place to love and care for him. Milo has given his powerful testimony several times to church congregations, speaking to strangers about his life struggles and the amazing changes that occurred while he was staying at Refuge of Hope.

Brian volunteers every week at Refuge of Hope’s Meal Ministry, giving his testimony to the volunteer groups that serve our dining room guests. Brian is always the first to offer his services as a way to give back to a community that so gracefully cared for and watched over him during a difficult time in his life.
