

"One of the most humbling experiences I have ever known is when a person I have served and helped throughout the years approaches me with a donation," said Jo Ann Carpenter, Meal Ministry Manager, "The following stories are examples of amazing acts of giving back."

He simply stated that he received love and hope in this dining room and wanted to be sure we moved into the new building so others may also receive that same hope.

BRETT: "I would just like to give back and thank you for caring about us." **JANDY:** "God has blessed me and this place is always feeding us and loving us."


SALLY: "You prayed for me, fed me, loved me and I am a part of this family."


EXPERIENCES RAPID GROWTH

Several recent news reports have indicated the economy may be picking up in Ohio. While that may be true for the state, the numbers at Refuge of Hope don't project quite the same rosy forecast for the local community.

2008	14,500 meals served
2009	21,500 meals served
2010	36,335 meals served
2011	46,331 meals served
2012 thru June	31,713 meals served
